
Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro,

I am requesting funding for Fire Station Alerting Network Resiliency in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is the City of San José, located at 200 E. Santa Clara Street, San Jose, California 95113. The funding would be used to replace aging, end-of-life routers used in alerting and emergency communications with modern hardware in all 34 of the City's Fire Stations, which cover 200 square miles. The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because reliable network connectivity is essential for fire station alerting, dispatch coordination, and emergency response. The existing routers are approaching their end of life and will no longer meet security or resiliency standards.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by 42 U.S.C.5305(a)(1), 5305(a)(2), 5305(a)(4), and/or 5305(a)(5).
